

How to Know Your Seat Number on Amtrak (2026)

This quick guide explains how seating works on Amtrak trains and how to find your seat or room assignment. Most Coach seats are open, while Business, First Class, and sleeper accommodations may include assigned seating.

Seat Assignment by Class

Class	Seat Assigned?	How It Works
Coach	No	Open seating (first-come, first-served)
Business	Sometimes	May be reserved depending on route
First Class (Acela)	Yes	Seat number on ticket
Sleeper (Roomette)	Yes	Room number assigned

Where to Check Your Seat

- 1 Printed or mobile ticket (look for car and seat if assigned)
- 2 Amtrak mobile app trip details
- 3 Station announcements and boarding info
- 4 Onboard conductor assistance

What Are Seat Checks?

On many trains, conductors place a paper seat check above your seat indicating your destination. This helps manage seating instead of fixed seat numbers in Coach class.

Tips to Find a Good Seat

- 1 Board early to get better seat options
- 2 Choose window seats for scenic views
- 3 Travel together? Board early to sit together
- 4 Follow conductor instructions for seating
- 5 Check your ticket before boarding

Common Mistakes to Avoid

- 1 Assuming Coach seats are assigned
- 2 Boarding late and losing seat choices
- 3 Ignoring seat check tags
- 4 Sitting in reserved areas accidentally
